

June 7, 2023 - The Brothers of Mu Iota devoted a




portion of its on-going neighborhood feeding mission to team with New Salem Baptist church.

Omega Gents is a **mentoring program** sponsored by the Mu Iota Chapter of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. The Program is designed to teach and encourage high school by defining, planning, pursuing and achieving life goals. The program



includes monthly workshops, college preparatory counseling and life coaching by exposure to black professional men. Mentorship or having someone who teaches or gives help and advice to a student influences the personal and prepares them for educational growth. Likewise distributing hats and gloves to students to protect them against the cold helps them to be physically ready to participate in the courses of instruction that promote educational growth.

Hats and Gloves Given to Area Residents

Mu Iota was driven to do what it could after being enlightened of the following sobering facts regarding the incidence of Breast Cancer in African American women that was taken from bcpp.org:



- 40% Breast Cancer
 Mortality Rate the highest of any U.S. racial or ethnic group
- Among women younger than 40, breast cancer incidence is higher among African American women than White women.
- Breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer death in the U.S. for AA Women
- Black women who used hair dye at least every 5-8 weeks had a 60% higher breast cancer risk.

Mu Iota paid \$500 into the College Endowment Fund.






